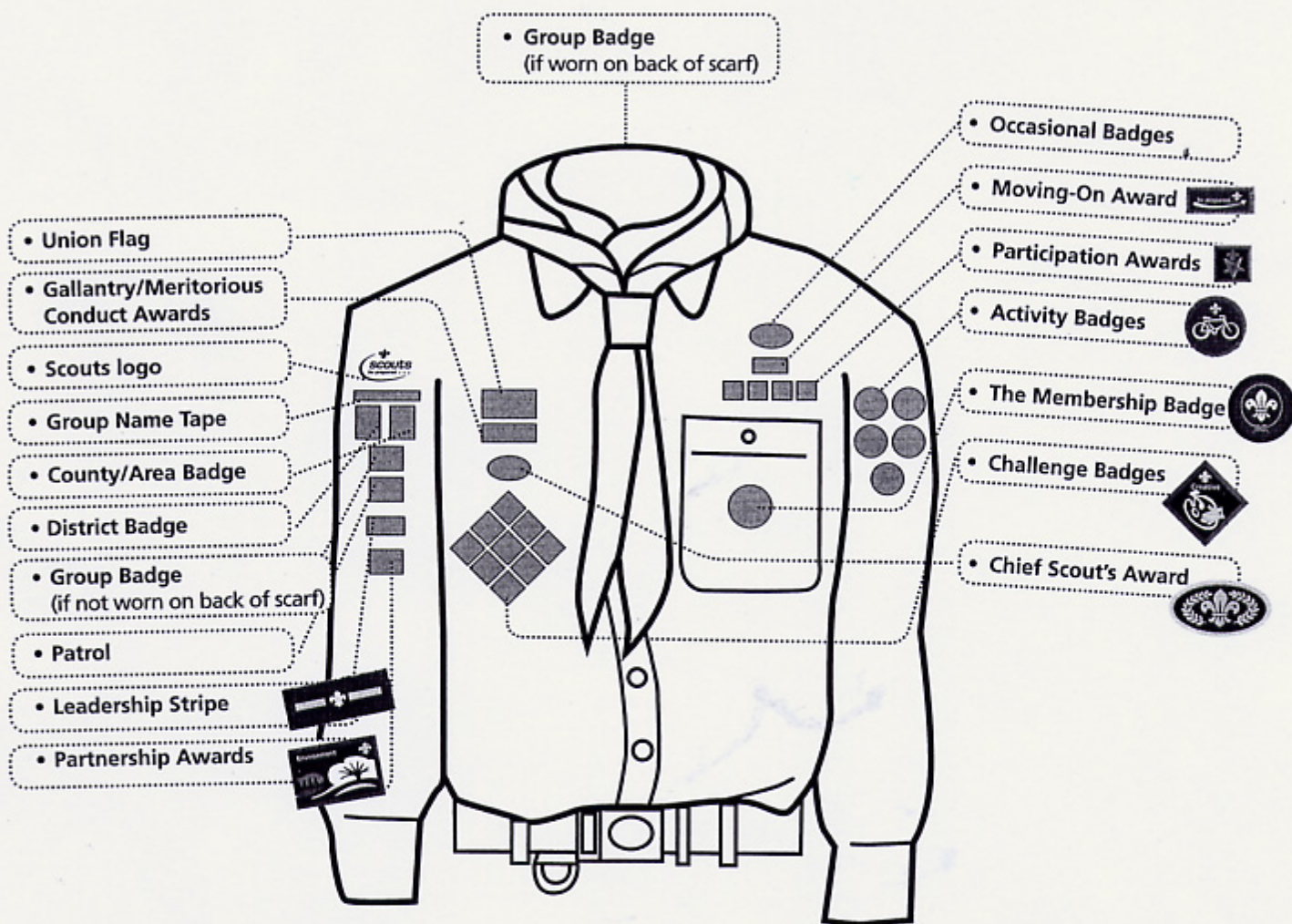

Country Badges

Scotland – The Scottish emblem, which is a St Andrew's Cross with the word Scotland below, is worn on the top of the right sleeve just below the Group name tape.

Wales – The Welsh flag is worn on the shoulders just above the seam, the dragon must be facing forward on both shoulders.

Northern Ireland – The Ulster badge is worn on the right sleeve, to the right of the County Badge. If a District Badge is worn as well, it is worn below the two in the centre.

The RNRAF Recognition Badge is worn on the front of the shirt/jersey as local tradition by those Groups who are part of the Recognition Scheme.
